
OF REPORTED THEFTS THIS QUARTER CAME FROM THEFT FROM INSIDE VEHICLES.




Accidents overall **DECREASED** by 16% in the 2nd quarter compared to the same time frame in 2016**. Each category saw a decrease except for Fatality accidents, which remained the same as last year at 0.

****Note: Due to changes in department policy, minor accidents must now meet certain criteria before being taken. Officers no longer take reports for ALL minor accidents.**

Incident reports are the written reports an officer takes when dispatched to a call, not to include Accident reports.


