



Accidents overall **DECREASED** by 26.6% in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter compared to the same time frame in 2016\*\*. Each category showed a decrease compared to last year, except for Hit and Run Injury Accidents and Fatality Accidents which remained the same at 0, and Personal Injury accidents which remained the same at 22.



Incident reports are the written reports an officer takes when dispatched to a call, not to include Accident reports.






